THE Amphibian Research Centre on New Farm Road in Werribee is giving away 2006 calendars with every \$12 donation to help save Australia's rarest frog, the southern corroboree.

The calendar is a tribute to frogs.

ARC photographer Lydia Fucsko has selected about 50 amphibian photos, including Wyndham's own growling grass frog and the spotted marsh frog (pictured), which can often be found hopping around the municipality.

"We are sure [the calendar] will take pride of place in the home or office of anyone lucky enough to have

purchased or received it as a gift," Ms Fucsko said.

"By donating to our fund-raiser, you are helping the southern corroboree frog release program, as all proceeds will be used to raise and care for the thousands of young frogs that are being raised at the [centre] for release to their habitat in Kosciuszko National Park."

Each calendar contains a specifically coded ticket that allows an entry into a draw to share nearly \$5000 in prizes.
